

Sustainable Rice Platform (SRP) Training Strategy Workshop “Harnessing Technology Convergence to Leverage Farmer Outreach”

3 – 4 May 2017

Venue: Seminar Room at the International Rice Research Institute (IRRI)
Los Baños, Philippines

Background

One of the SRP’s key commitments is to provide training programs to accompany the deployment of the Standard and Performance Indicators. Since its launch in 2015, members have expressed interest in implementing relevant trainings to cater for the needs of their respective networks and stakeholders. As multi-country field pilots were implemented in 2016, the Sustainable Rice Platform has already conducted a number of training workshops, with support from IRRI. However, as training needs are increasing and becoming more differentiated, it will be crucial to develop a coherent framework for SRP-related training at all levels.

This workshop brings together representatives of interested Sustainable Rice Platform members, many of whom have significant training capacity, to discuss needs and plan such a framework, bearing in mind technical, geographical and other complementarities in drafting a collaborative action plan. The workshop is organized by Peter Sprang, SRP’s Technical Coordinator, together with experts from IRRI, and hosted by IRRI at its headquarters in Los Baños, Philippines.

Note: Taking advantage of the presence of key SRP members, an additional meeting will be held on the afternoon and evening of 2 May to discuss the SRP assurance model. The discussion will continue during the group work session on the afternoon of 4 May and the morning of 5 May, if necessary.

Objectives

The SRP Training Strategy Workshop aims to:

1. Gather relevant field implementation experiences and practices, including an inventory of training materials;
2. Identify and describe target participants for SRP-related training programs;
3. Understand SRP members’ specific interests and requirements in the development and delivery of training; and
4. Develop a framework for a coherent set of SRP training programs, including: a) farmer training and Training of Trainers; b) group management systems / internal control systems; c) postharvest value chain training; d) auditor training; and e) general SRP training

Outputs

The main output from this activity will be a Workshop Report containing a draft programme and action plan for a Training Program Framework for the Sustainable Rice Platform.

Participants

Representatives of Sustainable Rice Platform member institutions and partners are invited to participate, particularly those with experience in implementing the Standard and Performance Indicators, and organizations with substantive interests, expertise and capacity in delivering training and/or development of training materials and media.

Costs

Participation in the workshop is free of charge, including accommodation at the IRRI dormitories, all meals as well as local transport (including group airport transfer). Participants are expected to cover their own flights, visa expenses and incidentals, including costs of accommodation for participants who choose to stay at the IRRI guesthouse (US\$65/night) rather than the dormitories.
